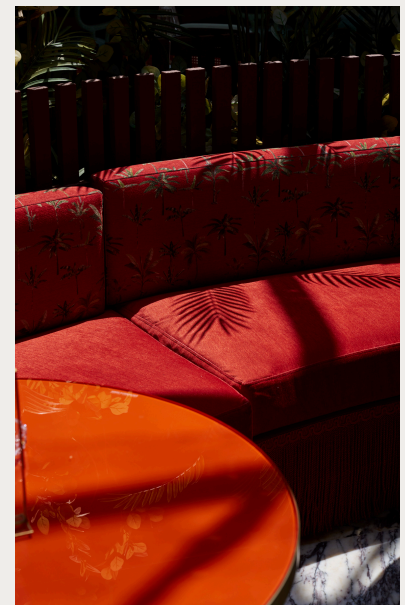
## Building Experiences: A Look Back at SCAS Commercial Spaces

# Monthly Tip When the Weather Turns, Stay in Control

Unpredictable weather conditions, ranging from heavy winds and airborne dust to sudden rain, can significantly impact visibility and road safety. In these moments, how you drive matters more than ever.



- Reduce Speed, Increase Control

Lower speeds give you more time to react. Avoid sudden braking or sharp movements - smooth driving keeps you in control.

- Use the Right Lights

Stick to low-beam headlights. They improve visibility without reflecting back off dust or rain.

- Keep a Safe Distance

Allow extra space between you and the vehicle ahead. Stopping distances increase in both wet and low-visibility conditions.

- Stay Focused, Minimize Distractions

Full attention on the road is critical. Even small distractions become dangerous when visibility is compromised.

- Know When to Stop

If conditions become severe, pull over safely and wait until visibility improves. No task or timeline is more important than your safety and wellbeing.

- Maintain Your Vehicle

Clean windshields, functioning wipers, and clear lights make a real difference when visibility is already limited.
